Chilli Outlook – July 2019


India is the world's largest producer, consumer and exporter of chillies in the world. India is the world leader in chilli production followed by China, Thailand, Ethiopia and Indonesia. Indian chilli is considered to be world famous for two important commercial qualities of color and pungency levels. Indian chilli is mainly exported to Asian countries like China, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Bangladesh, Singapore, Thailand and UAE etc. In India, major chilli producing states are Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh.

In Telangana, as on 3rd July 2019, an area of 196 hectares was reported under chilli as compared to 136 hectares in the corresponding period of last year. So far only two districts, i.e., Mahabubnagar and Medak started chilli sowing covering 186 ha and 10 ha respectively. Currently sowing activity reported lower due to lower rainfall. Chilli transplanting will start from August.

The trend in average monthly domestic and international chilli prices from January 2016 to May 2019 presented in Fig 1 clearly indicates that the domestic prices are highly influenced by international prices. The international chilli price which was 1.45 US\$/lb in November 2018 has fallen to 1.42 US\$/lb in December 2018 and sustained at 1.40 US\$/lb in January and February 2019. Domestic chilli price has increased to 89.00 Rs/Kg in May compared to previous month, 76.87 Rs/Kg.

In Telangana, 1,462 and 2,950 quintals of chilli arrivals was traded in Warangal and Khammam markets at Rs. 7200 - 10,500 and Rs. 4500 - 7700 respectively in the month of June 2019.

Current year total red chilli supply in Guntur market from 1st January 2019 to 28th June 2019 stands at around 281,925 MT as compared to 224,955 MT in the corresponding period of last year, supply up by 25.33% with an expectation of higher production in 2018-19.

Chilli price in Guntur market which reopened after summer vacation reported up due to lower cold storage stocks. Teja prices reported up due to good export demand. Good domestic and export demand from Bangladesh, China, Malaysia, Sri Lanka are reported at Guntur mandi.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Chilli is likely to trade in price range between **Rs. 8500 – 9000** per quintal in the month of July 2019.
