Cotton Outlook - April 2019

World Scenario

Global 2018-19 cotton area and production are projected at 33.1 million hectares (82 million acres) and 118.9 million bales, which were nearly 2 and 4 percent less than that of 2017-18 estimates respectively. Cotton production in most of the major producing countries except Brazil and Pakistan is expected to decline. India is projected to produce 27.0 million bales of cotton in 2018-19, which was 7 percent less than the production in 2017-18. Although yield is expected to rebound above the 5-year average, a 4 percent reduction in area is forecast in 2018-19. China is projected to produce 27.5 million bales of cotton in 2018-19. Meanwhile, production increases of 3.5 lakh bales for Brazil and 3.0 lakh bales for Pakistan in 2018-19 are projected to push their estimates to 11.75 and 7.7 million bales respectively.

Cotton benchmark prices were flat or slightly higher over the past month. Prices for the May NY futures contract increased over past month, climbing from levels just below 70 cents/lb in mid-February to those near 74 cents/lb recently. The A Index also rose, increasing from values below 80 to those near 83 cents/lb.

Chinese cotton prices represented by the CC Index (3128B) were essentially steady in both international and domestic terms (near 105 cents/lb or 15,500 RMB/ton). Indian spot prices (Shankar-6 quality) moved slightly higher in international (from 75 to 77 cents/lb) and domestic terms (from 41,700 to 42,400 INR/candy). Pakistani spot prices were steady at values equal to 76 cents/lb or 8,600 PKR/maund.

Indian domestic prices traded firm during last week of March, mainly due to lower daily arrivals and good demand for Indian cotton from China. All India cotton supplies are reported to be about 135 thousand bales per day. According to trade estimates, Indian traders have contracted for export of 5 lakh bales to China for shipments in the next two months.

Cotton price in Indian market is higher than that internationally. This is backed by higher MSP and purchases by CCI. The market may move up only through larger off take by exporters or by domestic industry. This may occur gradually over the next few months.

Indian Scenario

As on 20th September 2018, the area covered under cotton during current season was 120.64 lakh hectares, which was 124.44 lakh hectares during corresponding period of last year. Cotton production during 2018-19 was estimated at 358.70 lakh bales. Among the states, Gujarat stood first with 107.37 lakh bales followed by Maharashtra with 83.30 lakh bales and Telangana with 52.07 lakh bales, all these three states combined contributing nearly 67% to total cotton production during 2018-19.

However, the latest estimates by the Indian Cotton Association pegs domestic cotton production at 328 lakh bales for 2018-19 season, compared to its preliminary estimates of 348 lakh bales. The current year output is 10 percent lower than the 2017-18 season.

Domestic Trade information

The current price of 29 mm good quality cotton is Rs. 44,300 per candy in the spot trade, which was Rs. 41,000 per candy during same period of previous year. At this rate Indian cotton is having good parity for export. If this rate continues for another 45 days, India will achieve its export target of 50-53 lakh bales very easily.

Average price of lint at Sirsa during the 4th week of March was Rs. 4569 per maund (of 37.32 Kg each), slightly stronger from the previous week price of Rs. 4375. Cotton fiber (Shankar-6) average price was noticed slightly up trend in 4th week of March, Rs. 43360 per candy (of 355.6 Kg each), which was Rs. 41983 per candy previous week.

Cotton acreage fell drastically, due to water shortage, in key growing regions of Gujarat, Maharashtra and Karnataka, which together account for about half of the country's production. Cotton prices are steadily moving up even as about 70 per cent of the estimated crop has already arrived in the market. According to CCI, about 235 lakh bales (of 170 kg each) cotton have arrived in the market as on March 15.

Cotton in Telangana

Among the districts, Nalgonda and Sangareddy recorded increased area under cotton as compared to last year, while in all other districts the same was reduced.

Cotton Association of India had estimated exports for the 2018-19 season to decline by 27 per cent to 50 lakh bales, compared with the estimated exports of 69 lakh bales during last year. India's total cotton exports shipment is around 32 lakh bales up to February 2019. According to Cotton Association of India, cotton prices may rebound and rise around 10% by July 2019.

Cotton prices are expected to stay firm as the crop has been short by 10-12% over last year and due to exports, demand from International markets especially from China. Moreover, raising domestic demand and procurement by CCI also support prices. Currently prices are ruling above MSP which depicts that the traders are actively procuring cotton at competitive rates. However, the start of selling of its stock from last week of March by CCI may keep prices in range.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Cotton prices are likely to trade in price range between **Rs.5450-5900** per quintal during April 2019.
