Paddy Outlook - August 2020

Paddy is cultivated globally being one of the most important cereal crops worldwide. USDA in its November report had estimated the global availability of rice at 67.10 million tons in 2019-20 marketing season. The same has been increased by 6 lakh tons to 67.16 million tons in the December report. The main reason for this is the increase in China's production. USDA has increased China's rice production estimates by 7 lakh tons to 14.77 million tons, based on the latest data from the National Bureau of Statistics of China.

As per the ministry of Agriculture, kharif paddy acreage as on 24th July 2020 has increased by 17.33% to 220.24 lakh hectares (544.22 lakh acres) as compared to 187.70 lakh hectares (463.82 lakh acres) during the same period of last year. Higher acreage was covered in Uttar Pradesh 46.5 lakh ha (114.90 lakh acres), Chhattisgarh 28.75 lakh ha (71.04 lakh acres), Punjab 26.37 lakh ha (65.16 lakh acres), Bihar 17.59 lakh ha (43.47 lakh ha), Madhya Pradesh 16.53 lakh ha (40.85 lakh acres), Telangana 4.13 lakh ha (10.21 lakh acres) and Andhra Pradesh 4.09 lakh ha (10.11 lakh acres).

In Telangana, it has been sown in 15.52 lakh hectares (38.35 lakh acres) as on 05th August 2020 which is higher than 3.74 lakh hectares (9.24 lakh acres) covered during corresponding period of last year. Major paddy growing districts in Telangana are Nizamabad 1.42 lakh ha (3.52 lakh acres), Kamareddy 0.78 lakh ha (1.94 lakh acres), Karimnagar 0.77 lakh ha (1.90 lakh acres), Yadadri 0.62 lakh ha (1.54 lakh acres), Rajanna Siricilla 0.49 lakh ha(1.21 lakh acres), Siddipet 0.80 lakh ha (1.98 lakh acres), and Nalgonda 1.12 lakh ha (2.79 lakh acres).

Paddy Price Outlook

Record domestic production of rice and government releasing additional quantities of free rice since April'20 have depressed domestic prices in recent months. With more than sufficient government food grain (including paddy & rice) stocks, and the Government of India supplying free rice to 800 million people through November, prices are likely to remain weak through first quarter of MY 2020-21, if the production prospects for the upcoming crop are not affected by any major weather calamity.

Government estimates MY 2019-20 rice procurement up to July 27, 2020 at 50.4 MMT, compared to 43.9 MMT during the same period last year. The COVID19-led lockdown since March 2020 and government release of additional quantities of free grain for distribution to nearly 800 million population affected unmilled rice purchase by private trade, forcing farmers to offer higher quantities at the government purchase centers. Procurement has been significantly higher in most states, except Punjab and West Bengal.

Paddy farmers in Uttar Pradesh state are expecting a good crop due to above-average rain this monsoon. After several years, Uttar Pradesh farmers completed paddy plantation in more than 80 per cent of crop area in the third week of July.

Export prices of Indian rice rose this week while overriding the worsening corona virus crisis in the country leading to logistical snags. The prices of India's 5-percent broken parboiled variety went up from last week's price of USD 377- USD 382 per tonne to USD 380 - 385 per ton.

The strengthening of Thailand's Baht against Dollar has pushed the prices of benchmark 5-percent broken rice which rose to USD 465 - 483 as compared to USD 450 - 482 quoted last week. The rates for 5-percent broken rice in Vietnam remained unchanged at USD 440 - 450 per ton.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expects that Paddy-Grade-A (RNR) and Paddy-Common could trade in price ranges of Rs. 1900 – 2000 and Rs. 1550 - 1800 per quintal respectively during the month of August, 2020.
