Chilli Outlook - May 2020

India is the world's largest producer, consumer and exporter of chillies. India is the world leader in chilli production followed by China, Thailand, Ethiopia and Indonesia. Indian chilli is considered to be world famous for two important commercial qualities of color and pungency levels. Indian chilli is mainly exported to Asian countries like China, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Bangladesh, Singapore, Thailand, UAE, etc. In India, major chilli producing states are Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh.

In Telangana, as on 25th September 2019, an area of 45,028 hectares was reported under chilli as compared to 46,126 hectares in the corresponding period of last year. Among the districts, Khammam stood first with 14,268 ha followed by Mahabubabad (12,113 ha), Gadwal (9,328 ha), Suryapet (4,166 ha)and Warangal (Rural) (2387 ha).



From February 2020 onwards chilli prices in Guntur market reported down due to Corona virus and lower demand from China. China is one of the major buyers of Teja and 334 varieties. Chilli prices in all spot markets had come down due to their inactiveness because of covid 19, In the month of March, average monthly prices reported Rs.11,908/-qtl as against last month price of Rs.12,516/-qtl, i.e., down by 4.86%.

Chilli Price Outlook

Most of the markets reported closed due to pandemic corona virus issue. Chilli exports reported lower (around 60 - 70% from normal level) due to lockdown and lower activity from Mandi to Port level. However, traders are hopeful that government will take some measures in coming days to increase export activity and retain our (India's) clients in international chilli market.

In Andhra Pradesh, Red Chilli harvesting activity was almost completed and farmers are bringing their produce to cold storage on an average daily basis 2,500 - 3,500 bags. In Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, around 540,000 tonnes of chilli was in cold storage.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Chilli is likely to trade in price range between Rs.12,000 – 14,000 per quintal in the month of May 2020.
