Chilli Outlook - February 2021

India is the world's largest producer, consumer and exporter of chillies. India is the world leader in chilli production followed by China, Thailand, Ethiopia and Indonesia. Indian chilli is considered to be world famous for two important commercial qualities of color and pungency levels. Indian chilli is mainly exported to Asian countries like China, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Bangladesh, Singapore, Thailand, UAE, etc. In India, major chilli producing states are Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka and West Bengal.

In 2019-20, Telangana ranked second in chilli area, production and productivity i.e., 2.98 lakh acres, 3.06 lakh metric tonnes and 1545 Kg per acre respectively. Chilli area and production in Telangana account for 11.59% and 17% of all India area and production respectively. The major chilli growing districts are Khammam, Mahabubabad, Gadwal, Suryapet and Warangal (Rural). During 2020-21, 1.91 lakh acres is covered under chilli. According to the 1st advance estimates, Government of Telangana chilli production is estimated as 4.10 lakh metric tonnes during vanakalam (kharif) 2020-21.

From 1st January 2021 to 21st January 2021, red chilli supply in Guntur market is reported to add up to around 30,825 MT as compared to last year's 24,525 MT, up by 25.69% as stockiest were releasing their old stocks.

Chilli Price Outlook

Continued normal export demand reported from Vietnam, Malaysia and Indonesia at Guntur market, though the arrivals are lower of the Teja Deluxe variety. Increasing arrivals reported in major chilli markets as new crop supply started entering.

In Byadgi, new chilli arrivals continued, however mostly with high moisture and rain touch quality. As per trade sources, 70% fatki variety and 30% medium red quality reported.

Currently, cold stores stock continue to arrive at Guntur spot market at the rate of 60,000 – bags (1 bag = 45kg) per day from Guntur cold storages, where around 78,000 MT stocks are still stored, compared to 51,500 MT last year.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expect that Chilli is likely to trade in price range between Rs. 12,500 - 14,500 per quintal in the month of February 2021.
