Chilli Outlook - March 2021

India is the world's largest producer, consumer and exporter of chillies. India is the world leader in chilli production followed by China, Thailand, Ethiopia and Indonesia. Indian chilli is considered to be world famous for two important commercial qualities of color and pungency levels. Indian chilli is mainly exported to Asian countries like China, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Bangladesh, Singapore, Thailand, UAE, etc. In India, major chilli producing states are Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka and West Bengal.

In 2019-20, Telangana ranked second in chilli area, production and productivity i.e., 2.98 lakh acres, 3.06 lakh metric tonnes and 1545 Kg per acre respectively. Chilli area and production in Telangana account for 11.59% and 17% of all India area and production respectively. The major chilli growing districts are Khammam, Mahabubabad, Gadwal, Suryapet and Warangal (Rural). During 2020-21, 1.91 lakh acres is covered under chilli. According to the 1st advance estimates of Government of Telangana, chilli production is estimated as 4.10 lakh metric tonnes during vanakalam (kharif) 2020-21.

From the 1st January 2021 to 25th February 2021, red chilli supply in Guntur market is reported to add up to around 106,425 MT as compared to last year's 92,250 MT, up by 15.37% as stockiest were releasing their old stocks amid new crop arrivals.

Chilli Price Outlook

Expected higher production in the coming marketing year is the main reason for lower demand at higher levels. Continued increasing arrivals reported in major chilli market as new crop supply started entering with moisture quality.

In Warangal market, new arrivals reported around 35,000 - 36,000 bags, buyers reported inactive due to moisture quality. In Khammam market, new arrivals reported around 30,000 bags, buyers reported inactive due to moisture quality.

At Guntur market new arrivals from Kurnool, Prakasham, Badrachalam and Yemmiganur reported around 50,000 - 55,000 bags. As per trade information, good quality 90% and 10% rain touch quality reported. Steady to firm sentiment may witness in chilli market this month due to good quality supply reported.

Under these circumstances, Agricultural Market Intelligence Centre, PJTSAU expects that Chilli is likely to trade in price range between Rs. 12,500 – 14,500 per quintal in the month of March 2021.
